

“GRENADE MISSES THE TARGET” IT NEVER DOES

On March 6 two youth riding scooty lobbed hand grenade at the crowded Amira kadal market place. 42 people were injured. Two of later succumbed to their injuries. It was the third incident of grenade being lobbed at the same spot in the last two years.

Srinagar police acted swiftly and with the help of CCTV footages collected from as many as hundred CCTV cameras nabbed the culprits. Lobbing grenades at crowded markets has emerged as a new pattern. The rush gives perpetrators of crime advantage to escape from the scene of crime.

There have been instance when these perpetrators didn't leave the site of crime, rather watched the scenes of destruction, chaos and death by standing at a distance.

After every grenade blasts the usual statement from the police and security forces is, “the grenade blast at a security installation which missed the target and exploded near by resulting in death and destruction and injuries to many.”

Security agencies never tried to grasp the simple fact that why would terrorist at first place lob a grenade at a crowded spot. These statements churned out in a similar with similar wording for decades missed the point that they inadvertently exonerate the perpetrators of such crimes.

The grenade lobbying at a market places has a definite pattern. It is intentional and deliberate. Such an act has definite news value. It is a purely terrorist act aimed to intimidate people and propagate terrorist ideology which is inimical to the State. The security agencies by using the word “grenade missed the target” miss the point for squarely blaming, defaming and shaming terrorist for these acts. The usage of word “missed the target” give space for conspiracy theories and deflect the blame from terrorists to security agencies.

Grenade throwing is a simple and plain fact. Whether grenades misses the intended target or not it eventually results in destruction and death. It undermines the writ of the State. Security agencies are tasked to uphold the security and also pinpoint its enemies who need to be pointed even in its statement.

Aurat March For Afghan Women

W

e slip into dreams either to escape harsh realities or to see the realisation of our desires . In dreams we get into a state of trance where what we thought, desired, rooted takes shape seemingly close to reality. The fructification of desires is instant but momentary. It fades and crashes when rammed by reality.

Every year, March 8th is celebrated as International Women's day. A day in the year when women across the world celebrate their very being in their very own manner . Social media platforms get flooded with messages, pictures, quotes , memes and videos “celebrating” womanhood.

Celebrations where the other gender has neither the role nor the power to intrude. But celebration itself is subjective in both class and scale. Celebration is pronounced for women with entitlements but for those whose very existence is questioned, intruded, subjugated every nano-second it seems a utopian concept.

Nine months after Taliban regained control of Afghanistan about 9 million people are on the brink of starvation. Economy is on the verge of collapse. Its citizens , especially in Kabul and other towns who enjoyed normal life with vistas of economic development opening up, are watching all the gains going down the drain. They are being stripped of their basic rights.

The brutal Taliban regime brooks no dissent. Some daring ones are constantly threatened. They are forced to shift for their

safety Leading a sort of revolt against Taliban, as protest against this brutal regime is not short of revolt, are females. And they are not deterred by Talibani threats .

These educated , liberal, career oriented females know how banning education, segregation in classes or forcing a certain dress code works on the psychology of females which eventually denies them basic freedom They are seeing before themselves their dreams crashing after Taliban banned education. They are staring at dark tunnel. A tunnel which is coming after travelling the highway of liberty and freedom.

The brutal Taliban regime doesn't think twice at pointing guns at these women protesters or even whipping them in broad day light on the road. They are being constantly searched and hunted down. Taliban regime denies these reports. It doesn't even acknowledged these brutalities. But still doesn't have the answer why are women being arrested?

A news report cites Herat prison governor and his men implicated for the disappearance of the governor of women's prison . It's no surprise he denies his role. So where did the lady governor disappear? Does her disappearance matter to Taliban ? Taliban won't even dare you to question them.

Michelle Bachelet, High Commissioner of Human Rights, in her recent speech talked about women's rights and liberties being constrained and demanded women be given opportunity to “completely engage”

It's not just the brutality of the of Taliban that is threatening lives. Ever since it took over the government economic conditions have wreaked havoc. People are even selling kidneys to earn money to feed families. According to a report it's not just the men, even women too are selling body organs. But since the country is governed by Taliban and the seller is female so she will be paid less even for selling the same organs which reflects insanity

in public life.

She cited disturbing trend of enforced “disappearances” of activists and protestors. At the end of its current month-long session, the Geneva-based Human Rights Council, is expected to designate a special rapporteur on Afghanistan to investigate alleged violations by the Taliban and others.

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People are selling children mostly girls hoping they could at least survive with the buyer. In Bhadghis town girls as young as five for married into richer fami-

lies A woman named Ghousia sold her 2-yr old girl because as she had no other option of earning to feed her family.

On International Women's Day, the Taliban administration issued a statement declaring that they are committed to resolving the suffering of Afghan women. A brutal regime which has institutionalised gender discrimina-

tion and brutality against women, wished Afghan women on this day. It's sounds so Kafkaesque

The present regime has a history of brutalities against women. It's not diverted from it. Reading the history of brutalities of its first term from 1996 to 2001 very few were optimistic about change of heart among Talibanis despite their much acclaimed vows to re-



spect women's rights.

Seven months since Taliban seized power, Afghan women's long-held fears have come true. Most of girls' secondary schools have been closed, barriers erected from pursuing higher education, co-education outlawed- calling it the “root of all evils in society”. It has outlawed music and the employment of female in local radio stations. It even abolished Ministry of Women's Affairs, restricted their movement, barring them from leaving the country alone.

Now, by watching, noticing and reading what is being unfolded on Afghan females, do I have any reason to celebrate Women's Day? Though, I come from well placed family and is decently well educated but seeing the tragedy not far off I don't see any reason to celebrate it.

It's ironical that global reaction has been subdued. A “feminist foreign policy” is proudly claimed by a number of countries. However, the international response to these events is slow with little sign of a well-coordinated effort to protect Afghan women and girls' rights.

It seems international community is seemingly strengthening

Taliban regime by sending all-male delegations there. Afghan women's struggle is the struggle of every women across the world and need to be supported.

This year the theme of Women's Day theme is #BreakTheBias. It requires concerted effort to realise this theme. While the rest of the world is discussing methods to improve condition of women, Pakistani women are facing question whether to express their concern in public or not?

Since 2018 on this day 'Aurat March' (March of Women) is held. As its popularity and influence increased, so has the opposition against it. In 2020, organiser had to approach the court to hold this march. The scale and popularity has unshackled Pakistan's traditionally patriarchal society.

Women in large number participated the event held at Karachi's ancient Frere Hall gardens who raise voice for inheritance rights, right to education, access to health care, fair salaries, unpaid labour, domestic abuse, the demand for safety at work and in public spaces, and other issues were highlighted through signs and speeches.

In 2019 march, the slogan which created a sensation of sort was 'Mera jism, meri marzi,'. Its essence was twisted to suit patriarchal society but the attempts failed. Women defiantly continued to raise this slogan. Actress Mahira Khan, came out in its support of the march, explaining what the slogan meant on Facebook. Ladies wearing burqas, hijabs marched in unison with women wearing shalwar kameez. Some even not wearing dupattas.

There were women dressed in saris, jeans and T-Shirts. It allowed participants to engage in dialogue and gain a better understanding of various viewpoints. It didn't go well with the orthodox section whose idea of women are “weaker” gender who are to be “Owned” than being equal partner. Last year a doctored video of march surfaced making it appear as if the participants had committed “blasphemy,” an allegation that can lead to vigilante killings in Pakistan. The storm cooled down only after Geo TV presenter Shahzaib Khanzada demonstrated how the video was manipulated.

This year's Aurat March demanded not only gender equality, but also economic justice, implementation of labour rights, provision of maternity leave and daycare centres, the promotion of an anti-war agenda, access to a fair judicial system, and the inclusion of women with disabilities and the transgender community, to name a few. I sense women of Pakistan are hell bent to drive patriarchy out of there lives.

It gives some reason for celebration. But it is part of the whole. The whole encompasses women of Afghanistan too. Hope the wheel of change rolls down Taliban regime which is not far off from the site of Aurat March.

**Whose Purpose
Does It Serve?**

recall when the then prime minister Atal Bihari Vajpayee visited Pakistan in 1999 and said, “a stable, secure and prosperous Pakistan is in India’s interest.” The same sentiment was echoed by Vajpayee’s successor Dr Manmohan Singh on many occasions during his first stint as prime minister.

The sentiment and assertions by two political stalwarts of contemporary India stand vindicated even today. Pakistan is currently in mess socially, politically and economically. Its chaos has an impact on the security scenario with India.

As Pakistani establishment has

nothing constructive to offer to its people. It only invokes “enemy India” discourse to divert attention from the real issues facing its people. Pakistan is bleeding itself because of religious radicalization, sectarian violence and sinking economy.

The point I am drawing home is in whose interest does a bleeding Kashmir serve. The answer lies in the events which started unfolding since 1st March 2022. There is sudden spike in militancy especially civilian killings.

Kashmir central has published a couple of stories in February based on inputs that ISI has directed militant groups operating in Kashmir to intensify the at-

tacks on soft targets particularly panchs, sarpanch and political workers. Kashmir Central also revealed that as part of this strategy grenade attacks at crowded places will increase.

The strategy is to inflict maximum civilian casualties. It’s absolutely immaterial who is killed. It won’t matter to perpetrators if those killed are police personnel, political worker, a civilian, an elderly man or a young girl of class 12th. The aim to stoke vicious cycle of violence and senseless deaths.

Kashmir must remain in news for violence and bloodshed. Pakistan wrests its whole foreign policy on the premise that, “Kashmir

is bleeding”. It is this “bleeding Kashmir” premise which Pakistan places before the international community. Due to some historical events the Pakistan is seen as a “stakeholders” in Kashmir.

POWER SECTOR REFORMS KEY TO ROOTING OUT SYSTEMATIC CORRUPTION

This year Kashmir witnessed a vast improvement in power supply even in remote areas. There were cuts but they were scheduled. The non-metered areas faced power cuts for three hours and metered areas for 1.5 hours.

So why has power situation improved this year? Ever since Nitishwar Kumar, Principal Secretary to the Lieutenant Governor Manoj Sinha, had taken charge as its head, he made it a point to improve power scenario.

He ensured department works hard in providing relief to the people. A monumental decision was taken for regularization of all legitimate daily wagers in the Power Department Development (PDD), who were pleading with authorities for their regularization for years. The government decided to have courage and heed to their demands. These steps ensured PDD department started coming back on track. There is visible improvement as people have less complaints.

Now the only apprehension and fear among people is about privatization. Privatization essentially is a means to discipline the system. A tool to ensure improved power system where consumers and the service providers are equal stakeholders. A debate has generated whether it is in the interest of the large population or not.

Without digressing from the issue, let's stick to the key issue about the improvement in power scenario. Power theft was a major concern in Jammu and Kashmir. The PDD workers were complicit in this theft is a common knowledge. It corrupted the people and system alike. System was systematically corroded, rusted

and eventually collapsed.

However, systematic improvement in many departments remains unattended. There may have been seriousness at the highest level but at most junior level the system continued to subject ordinary people to hardships.

The revenue department has been streamlined to an extent that in the coming months Pat-

waris would have the least role. Remember a sitting minister during PDP government had said in the assembly that Patwaris act like as if they are commissioner/secretary

In an administrative and revenue set up Tehsildar is an important institution and it can't be denied that this authority is misused to the disadvantage of

common people.

Young fresh KAS officers deputed in the revenue department are trying to improve the system. The present set up corrupted for decades still allows room for Patwaris, Tehsildar to tweak the system, make fraud deals, mutation of land, etc for monetary gains.

Recently a resident of downtown Srinagar, who didn't want to be identified, narrated his experience of the revenue department. He wanted to sell his property in the downtown Srinagar valued Rs 50 lakh. Patwari and Tehsildar told him papers are incomplete and he need to pay 65000 for them. He didn't have

the money and requested them to lessen their demand. They finally agreed for Rs 50,000.

He somehow was not convinced with justification for amount demanded. Being not so educated, he requested someone to inquire about the fees for this affair and later got to know that the formal fees is only Rs 1100.

The said fellow confronted the officials but they bluntly replied unless he pays them the said amount they wouldn't do the paper work which he needed. A fear creped in that if he complains they might temper with his records. After much of cajoling, begging and persuasion they



agreed for Rs 35,000. Remember the formal fee was only Rs 1100. Some reports suggest even young KAS officers, too, are vulnerable to doctoring for financial gains.

Engineering wings of the departments remain the root cause of dissatisfaction among the people. It is pretty common that a chain of mafia runs among contractors and engineers. Petty contractors execute works below the e-tendering limits. Political workers of different political parties at the village level are also part of this nexus.

It has been observed that these political workers who would earlier embezzle the constituency development funds on a commission basis are now active in the engineering wings

It's one of the reasons why DDC, BDC institutions have not been able to take root. The rural development department has become a den for such illicit nexus of VLW, JEE, BDO. The officer heading the department try to accommodate their blue-eyed political workers, rather than going by the rule book.

The disaffection among the

villagers is not on account of the fact that services have not improved. In fact the rural infrastructure is revolutionizing and connectivity is unprecedented. But, it is the intervention of the political workers of former ruling parties in the affairs of the grass-root governance which repulses them

There are numerous media reports of Panch's, Sarpanch, DDCs, BDC's protesting for not being heard by the administration at lower levels.

Recently KASHMIR CENTRAL received a call from anonymous casual laborers from Bijbehara saying the authorities are not releasing their wages. In 2004 under PDP rule when the wildlife park Sanctuary was constructed in Pahalgam, 17 casual laborers were engaged on the recommendation of political bosses.

Then gradually more were engaged and number swelled up to 474 now. The majority of them are working at their homes. Many are doing their businesses. Salaries are now released for those who are marked present in

the attendance registered.

KASHMIR CENTRAL on coming to know about it approached the concerned DFO. The officer on realising that we are doing a story stopped receiving the calls. He was approached by another phone and did receive the call. On being asked for more details he side-stepped the question and never gave detail. It's not clear how these casual laborers were engaged. It's symptomatic of the rot in the system corrupted by corrupt politicians.

Conflict was used as shield to indulge in rampant corruption by politicians who engaged numerous people as daily wager beyond prescribed limit. An entire eco system was created to facilitate this loot of state ex chequer.

People were engaged by taking financial benefits which were pocketed by politicians and their touts where there was no scope for such engagements. They were then promised engaging them as permanent employees, which would never happen. It's not the system but politicians who rendered people unemployed. While the government finding itself in a fix is extending every possible assistance to such people who were engaged but a commission should also be set up to probe the role of politicians and their facilitators in department for these engagements.

Srinagar Mayor Junaid Mattu said that Rafiya had just passed her Class 12 examination with flying colours and was preparing for her professional entrance examinations. Innocently the girl went to Lal Chowk to buy books for competitive examinations.

Let us look at this clearly. It does not matter whether our children want to become doctors, engineers, chartered accountants, architects, musicians. Our sons and daughters can get killed by militants if they go to the neighbourhood market to buy books.

Rafiya died due to multiple injuries that she had suffered in the blast. Is this what the life of our children is worth?

My parents were so proud and happy for me. My father Nazir Ahmad Tinda used to see a doctor in me. He was all set to invest in my studies and make me self-reliant.

I could see a sparkle in their eyes for me. I could see my bright future in their eyes. Everything was going so well.

As we were still enjoying the first step of my success, our happiness turned into grief. That man with the grenade finished it all. He shattered my dreams, he took me away from Papa and Mama. He left my elder sister all alone.

What was my fault?

Why did you kill me?

Did I know you? Did you know me? Did you know that uncle who was killed with me?

I was not ready for this. I was not ready to leave my family. I was crying and trying to find a way to get back to my Mama, Papa. They are crying like hell. I CAN'T SEE MY MOTHER CRYING LIKE THIS. Who will take care of my family? Who will be Papa's princess? Who will irritate mama? Who will be my sister's best friend? I can't see my family wailing for me like this

Did you know those people who were injured with me?

Had we ever done any harm to you?

Noooo...

Then why did you kill us? Why did you shatter my family's dream?

What was our fault? What did you achieve by killing me, by killing all of us?

There can be no justification for such a reprehensible attack. Allah will not forgive you for it. You think you shall attain hoor in jannat for this attack? No. For bringing untimely death to others, Allah will burn you in hell.

What was my fault? Tell me! Tell me!

I had just gone to Lal Chowk for some shopping and to buy books with my mother and elder sister. We were happily walking. All of a sudden you threw a grenade. You didn't even think for a second that we were innocent. You mindlessly threw it.

We heard a big blast and got injured by the sharp things flying around. My body got torn by those sharp things. I had no time to compile what had happened to me. I fell unconscious and rest I don't know. When I woke up, I was in another world. I was in heaven wearing white clothes but this white cloth was not my doctor's apron. It was my Kafan. I met a lot of youngsters who too were fallen by unknown bullets at different times. I learned here that they too had dreams like me, family-like mine but were killed by terrorists without their fault.

I was not ready for this. I was not ready to leave my family. I was crying and trying to find a way to get back to my Mama, Papa. They are crying like hell. I can't see my mother crying like this. Who will take care of my family? Who will be Papa's princess? Who will irritate mama? Who will be my sister's best friend? I can't see my family wailing for me like this.

All the men and women and youngsters and children whose death you all had caused before me came and tried to console me. They too were not happy because they were concerned about their family and wanted to know about them. The youngsters and children asked me how their parents were feeling when they were snatched from them. I had no answers. I saw their pain. I saw pain in the rawest form. I had only one thing that I could tell them. Buds are falling to the bullets of hate and there is no blossom in our spring.



We heard a big blast and got injured by the sharp things flying around. MY BODY GOT TORN BY THOSE SHARP THINGS. I had no time to compile what had happened to me. I FELL UNCONSCIOUS AND REST I DON'T KNOW



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

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
