



# NEIGHBOURS, GET A REALITY CHECK!

**In the face of an economic crisis, the mullahs and some defense representatives in Pakistan have been giving out irresponsible statements. Time to check on some reality!**

In the backdrop of Pakistan facing one of its worst economic crisis, the *mullahs* of that country are threatening the world of nuclear bombing if any country insisted on payment of debts.

Pakistan is dealing with an unprecedented inflation, a depreciating currency and lowest foreign reserves. The country is reeling under darkness owing to the collapsing of its systems. Factories are shut and vehicles are off the roads owing to the shortage of fuel and energy.

Videos of *mullahs* threatening the world of dire consequences if the country were not bailed out - have been surfacing quite a lot recently. So much so, some hawkish so-called defense experts are also making irresponsible statements about the use of nuclear warheads. Such irresponsible and bizarre statements coming from illiterate *mullahs* and the educated alike, is alarming. A so-called defense expert has gone to the extent of saying that if the world forces Pakistan to return debts, they will sell nuclear war heads to their Muslim countries. After giving five to the Saudis, five to Iran and five to Turkey, "we will still have 140", he said. This, he added, would scare the world. 

# SOLDIERING ON, OR TIME TO GO HOME?

As per some senior sources from the Ministry of Defence, owing to the new-found peace in some areas of Jammu & Kashmir, the presence of the Army may soon be minimised there, discovers Kashmir Central



Now we could be staring into a path-breaking step here!

The Government of India is mulling over minimising the presence of the Army in the south of Pirpanjal in Poonch and Rajouri districts and the north of Srinagar in Baramulla, Kupwara and Bandipora districts.

Yes. Kashmir Central has learned from credible sources in the Ministry of Defence that the government is seriously considering gradual withdrawal of the Army from certain pockets in north Kashmir in the Kashmir division and Poonch and Rajouri districts in the Jammu province. The proposal is at an advanced stage and being discussed at inter-ministerial level.

Some sources in the Defence Ministry have told *Kashmir Central* that the proposal,

though feasible, is under serious discussion, However, a decision can't be expected very soon

because the involvement of all the stakeholders is inevitable. The sources also said that



the withdrawal of the Army is initially proposed in the south of Pirpanjal - that is Poonch, Rajouri and Doda and Kishtiwari districts. The sources confirmed that a series of inter-ministerial discussions has already taken place on the proposal and there is, by and large, agreement on the fact that given the improvement in the overall security scenario in Jammu and Kashmir, it would be appropriate to minimise the footprints of the Army in comparatively peaceful areas of Jammu and Kashmir. It is however proposed that the Army shall continue to man the Line Of Control. The sources however, refused to divulge the details but hinted at withdrawal of the Rashtriya




Rifles units which had been on the forefront in counter-insurgency operations from some areas of north Kashmir on an experimental basis. “We can withdraw according to the situation and re-deploy if the situation demands - what is the big deal in it!” a senior officer in the Ministry of Defence told this scribe.

He added there was no harm in relocating the Army if the situation demanded. “We have an eagle’s eye and we keep assessing the ground situation on a daily basis. As of now, it looks reasonable to withdraw a sizeable number of Rashtriya Rifles from certain areas in north Kashmir and the south of Pirpanjal,” he said.

The officer also said that the decision had to be taken in consultation with the Ministry of Home Affairs and the Jammu and Kashmir government because it shall be a sort of replacement of the Army by the CRPF - which comes under the Ministry of Home Affairs. He added that the decision to this effect could take some time because of the nuances and sensitivities involved.

This merits a mention that post the abrogation of Article 370 in 2019, the law and order situation in Kashmir valley has improved considerably.



The level of violence has come down. It is also interesting to note that since February 2022, with the renewal of the ceasefire agreement of 2003, the infiltration attempts across the LOC and the international border have also gone down considerably. The year 2022 witnessed the least number of infiltration in the recent years. On the other hand, the security forces were able to gun down the top terrorist commanders of almost all the active terrorist organisations in Jammu and Kashmir. The integrated efforts by the Army, paramilitary troops and the Jammu & Kashmir police resulted in elimination of more than 150 terrorists during the year 2022.

The year 2022 also witnessed the lowest number of recruitments in terrorist camps. The only cause for concern through the year was the targeted killings of civilians, particularly of a minority community.

But let this be known too that there are credible intelligence inputs that terrorists may try to vitiate the atmosphere in the months of Spring. As the G-20 summit is happening in India and some events are also scheduled for Kashmir, there will be attempts to create some kind of nuisance to destabilise the situation.

It is, however, not clear if the decision to withdraw the Army from the north of Kashmir would be taken before or after the G-20 summit.

# BREAK THROUGH FALSENESS

**T**he anti-encroachment drive has been suspended by the UT administration for all the good reasons but not before creating a situation wherein people ended up with a sense of insecurity and alienation.

As reported earlier, the anti-encroachment drive was stopped after the intervention of the Ministry of Home Affairs. This merits a mention here that LG

Manoj Sinha had, on several occasions, directed officers not to harass poor people who are petty encroachers. The Kashmir Central learned from credible inside sources that whenever meetings were convened by the LG to discuss the retrieval of the encroached State land, there would come clear-cut instruction on not touching the petty encroachers. The deputy commissioners were directed to monitor the retrieval drive personally on a daily basis, to ensure that poor people were not affected. However the instructions were often breached, as observed by the field officers. The poor and the under-privileged were targeted immediately since they were perceived to be shielding the big sharks. The aggressive anti-poor actions of the field officers created chaotic situations across Jammu and Kashmir. The directions of LG Sinha and his assurances to the people fell on deaf ears. There was hue and cry as field officers exploited the situation fully for ulterior motives. The field agencies indulged in virtual loot, rampant corruption, abuse of power and dignity. On the other hand, adversaries of the State tried to fish in the troubled waters. They jumped in to create a narrative which had the potential to undo what was achieved in the last three years. The political class was also given an issue on a platter and it was but natural for the political leaders to respond to the situation in a very aggressive manner.



## CREATING NOTIONS

There is a proverb in Kashmiri – ‘Varmulli kheayay oontan kapas, banihalli tchetekh doonis nas’ – meaning someone else is convicted for someone else’s crime. The complex psyche in Kashmir has been, for decades, fully exploited, rather influenced by the non-State narrative. An action of a patwaari or a tehsildar or any other government official which goes against the interests of a group of people, is always seen as a conspiracy hatched and orchestrated in New Delhi. The so-called alienation in Kashmir is something the genesis of which, is local. A government servant is seen as an instrument of the State. His personal likes, dislikes, actions and non-actions are attributed to ‘the government policy’.

The narrative of ‘altering’ the demography is nothing but the action of the government servants to see how people’s psyche can be impacted. The narration, interpretation and

execution of government orders by the officers at the lower level are actually at the core of public opinion. For instance, take the suspension of the anti-encroachment drive itself. It is no more a secret that the Ministry of Home Affairs expressed its displeasure over the mess created by the anti-encroachment drive and directions were issued to the UT administration to suspend it and formulate a comprehensive policy wherein people had the right to be heard before going for any offensive. But nobody is speaking about the directions of the Home Minister! It has not become a narrative. Even political leaders didn’t hale the intervention. There is complete silence on this. What is still selling like hot cakes is ‘the execution of demography plan by the tehsildar and the patwaari’. It will remain there because it suits the so called stakeholders.

So who is to be blamed for this mountain out of mole narrative? The bureaucracy at the senior level gullibly ignores

the actions of the field agencies and their implications on the overall security situation in Jammu and Kashmir. Unlike other parts of the country, a government servant in the Kashmir valley represents the State in totality. His personal likes, dislikes, weaknesses, strengths - everything is clubbed with the policy-planning at the highest level. And interestingly a government servant enjoys this status till his superannuation.

‘More loyal than the king’ would not be appropriate to fit in here. He is rather more lethal than the hard power of the State and even more lethal than the non-State, gun-yielding actors. It is only after his retirement that a government would become a rebel. Now he would expose ‘intentions and designs’ of the State and its institutions. He would “educate” people about the fascist approach of the State towards the people. He would

be on the masque committee and welfare committee to influence the illiterate and the uneducated with his poisonous hypocrisy. The hasty actions and bureaucratic adventurism have the potential to vitiate the atmosphere because peace is not a static position. There is an honest admission by some senior bureaucrats that the government has only succeeded in maintaining law and order through various security and



other measures. According to them, peace is still elusive. Peace cannot be measured through non-violence alone. We need to understand this difference. Behavior of the people has changed beyond doubt. There is disillusionment with violence and separatism. There is a realisation that violence only brings death and destruction. There is calm. But is this real peace - is the question that needs a detailed analysis.




## THE REAL IRRITANTS

There are two irritants in establishing a lasting narrative of peace in Jammu and Kashmir. The political leaders, irrespective of party affiliations, are propagating a particular thought process not aligned with the idea of integration. They are guided by certain compulsions which don't allow them to be realistic and rational. The compulsions are both real and perceived. They have fears that realism and rationalism don't fetch votes. Excitement and emotive politics do.

Secondly there are hardly any efforts by the administration to instill confidence in the masses. We are facing a unique situation in Kashmir where pro-people measures finally end up as 'anti-people' essentially because of the powerful anti-State machinery working day and night to instill fear and insecurity among the masses viz-a-viz the government decisions whatsoever. The situation

is more unique because the decision-making bodies have so far failed in interpretation of the decisions taken. There is hardly any mechanism in place through which people could be educated about the government policies. The decisions whatsoever, therefore, are free for interpretation and are looked upon with suspicion. With a certain degree of authenticity, it could be argued, that government decisions may be in the right earnest but the decision making institutions and individuals have failed to address the element of suspension and insecurity. The complex situation is exploited by the adversaries of the State and the anti-State narrative is somehow attractive for the general public. At times, the administrative apparatus creates confusion again because there are little efforts towards changing the perception of the people.



## SPOILSPORTS

Government's ill-conceived idea of pampering individuals and organisations with doubtful credentials for the propagation of government policies, has proved counterproductive.

And then, the arrogance and aggression of the layers of power is definitely coming in the way of perception management. Officers at all levels are working with a certain mindset. They are law unto themselves as they

believe they are not answerable for their actions. Though the most powerful ones could not evade the long arms of the law, however, the impression is quite contrary.

As argued before, every single government symbolises the State and their arrogance and actions are seen in consonance with the policy of the government.

# KHELO INDIA: SPO (R)T ON!

**K**helo India Winter Games 2023 saw a mega and a glittering ceremony in Gulmarg, Jammu & Kashmir a few days back. This was the third edition of the tournament under the Khelo India Initiative by the Indian government.

Around 1,500 athletes from all over the country participated in this edition of the games. Gulmarg and Leh had jointly hosted the first two editions of the competition in 2020 and 2021. The Khelo India Winter Games 2023 were jointly organised by India's Ministry of Youth Affairs and

Sports, the Jammu & Kashmir Sports Council as well as the Winter Games Association of Jammu & Kashmir.

The games this season featured over 1,500 athletes from across the nation, competing in 11 winter sports. Sports like alpine skiing, curling, bobsleigh, skeleton, snowshoe, Nordic skiing, snowboarding, ski mountaineering, ice skating, ice hockey and bandy featured at KIWG 2023.

The mega sports event was declared open in the presence of Hon'ble Lieutenant Governor of J&K Manoj Sinha and Hon'ble Union Minister for Youth Affairs & Sports and I&B Anurag Thakur.

Speaking at the occasion, LG Manoj Sinha complemented and greeted the athletes for their participation. He promised that J&K would organise more such games in the future so that the talent of the youth be harnessed well.

He said in his opening speech: "Khelo India Winter Games will celebrate and honour sporting excellence and witness the contests of skill and endurance of athletes. It is a great occasion to strive for the greatest victory, to uphold the spirit of sportsmanship, peace, equality, friendship and respect for competitors. The spirit of oneness, Ek Bharat, Shresht Bharat will make us stronger".

The opening ceremony was streamed live on Prasar Bharti, DD Sports as well as on the official YouTube channel of the J&K Sports Council.

Union Sports Minister Anurag Thakur lauded the J&K Government for developing sports facilities at grassroots level and achieving unprecedented progress in the sports sector over a short span of time. He said, "Jammu & Kashmir has achieved an

immense sports infrastructure and enthusiasm over the last three years. Indoor sports facilities have been built in every district and every village has been connected with a playground".

"Once known for stone pelting, J&K is now treading



the path of sports like Wushu, football and cricket. This is the new picture of Jammu & Kashmir visualised by PM Narendra Modi”, he added.

Notably, the idea of holding the National Winter Games in J&K was implemented after the scrapping of Article 370, a temporary provision in the Constitution, in 2019.

Ravi Kumar, an athlete from Rajasthan, who has participated in various international events, was impressed by the arrangements made by the J&K Sports Council. He remarked: “I have participated in a number of international games along with the World Championship conducted in Italy recently. Since 2019, I’ve been participating in Khelo India Winter Games in J&K. The local administration has made great arrangements for the athletes as per need”.



Meanwhile, PM Narendra Modi had sent his best wishes for a successful event via twitter. He wrote: “Best wishes to all athletes taking part in the 3rd Khelo India National Winter Games. The Games are

being held in the picturesque surroundings of Gulmarg. This will also boost the sporting culture in Jammu & Kashmir”.

The event witnessed cultural performances along with sports competitions. A number of local

artists and vocalists performed at the week-long event.

At the culmination of the event, J&K topped the medal tally, bagging 26 gold medals, 25 silver medals, 25 bronze medals followed by Maharashtra with 13 gold, 8 silver and 6 bronze medals. The third position was achieved by Himachal Pradesh with 10 gold, 14 silver and 7 bronze medals while the Army took 10 gold, 10 silver and 9 bronze medals.

The sensation of the event was Eklavya Jagal, a Class X student from Amity International School, Noida, who won two gold medals in the short track ice skating event under the 15-19 years age group.

Eklavya has also been a national medalist for the last seven years in Short Track Ice Skating Championships. He has represented India at various international ice skating events as well.

Speaking at the closing ceremony, Union Minister of



State for Home Affairs and Youth Affairs and Sports Nishit Pramanik remarked that the 3rd Khelo India Winter Games turned out to be a major event compared to the previous events. He hoped that the next event would be even bigger and will be comparable to international events.

He also mentioned how players like Sarfaraz Ahmad and Arif Khan, who played in the Winter Olympics, made our nation proud. "In the last two years, the government has developed indoor stadiums in every district of Jammu & Kashmir besides playgrounds in every panchayat," he said, underlining J&K's transition


into a new era of prosperity.

The general public that witnessed the event was left impressed and proud. Abdul Hameed, who owns a local shop in Gulmarg, said that such events boosted their business and participation by every section opened more avenues for the business community. "Such events with such mega participation from both local and national players boost our daily businesses. We want more such events and they will go a long way in uplifting our economy and buoying up businesses in the State which had been seeing a dead end until some years back".

university. He accused that I had written all this to garner male interest. I was surprised but then I have faced such stuff so much that I have learnt to ignore it. In fact, if you go to the instagram pages of female influencers, you will see both positive and negative comments.

Recently I read a post on Facebook that praised Jasia Akhter for becoming the first female cricketer from Shopian to secure a contract of Rs 20 lakh in an auction as base price. The post, written in a simple language, held so much pride that a daughter of Kashmir had made it so good in her field. Sports is, after all, not something too common among the women in Kashmir. Of course, women do play, but they never make it a career choice. But with changing times, women are entering this field too and building careers here. The only thing shocking in this post were the comments made

by some I would call 'badly raised men' who satisfy their fragile egos by making nasty comments about women.

One among such comments was by one Tariq Ahmad Dar who wrote "Pehle mujhe batao ye mard hai ya aurat". Another one - SK Ramajan - wrote: "Looks like a male", while one Nazir Kumar said "Please is he or she". Another one - Amir Iqbal - wrote: "I don't think she is a girl!" while another one said: "Yeh gay hai". There were so many such comments that soon I was too discouraged to read further. I was wondering if these men behaved like this with their own families too. Do they say such mean things to their sisters or female friends as well? How can people say such terrible things


to someone just because they don't fit their ideas of beauty?

I feel that these are just badly raised men who haven't been taught how to talk or say things? But this raises more questions than it answers because we Kashmiris are known for our politeness which is inherent to both men and women. But if this is how our males talk about women, haven't we failed as a

society to raise good men?

I talked to some women about this issue and many of them shared similar opinions because most of them, were, at some point, the target of such abuse too. A friend of mine Mehak Wazir said: "I have seen many such comments. I used to upload reels on instagram and many guys would just write things like "you aren't that pretty", or "stop using filters" etc. All this did affect me at first but then I realised that these were just men who satisfy their egos by making other people feel bad about themselves and we should not care about it".

I showed these comments to a beautician - Shabina who said: "I earn my livelihood by beautifying women but I always



tell my clients they are already beautiful and all I do is, bring that beauty out. But these kind of comments discourage me. How sad to see men say all these things about women without thinking. Where do they come from, what are they being taught? If my brother or my son were to say such things about a girl, then I would consider myself a failure as a sister, as a mother and as a woman".

But there is always hope. Even though Jasia Akhter attracted many nasty comments; there were still some people who left comments of encouragement for the young cricketer and they came from some men too. Not only did these men criticise the ones who ridiculed the cricketer, they left comments filled with great encouragement.

Indeed, such men are the reason why women believe in themselves and can walk shoulder to shoulder with their male counterparts.
